Paid/Unpaid Internships or Internships for Credit for Franklin and Marshall College

- *When may internships occur?*

Internships may occur during the academic year or summer.

- *What internship experiences are eligible for academic credit?*

- Internships must take place at off-campus organizations.
- Internships may be counted for credit toward a major or minor *at the discretion of the relevant department or program.*
- Internships that are embedded in off-campus study programs that have already been approved by the College (e.g., study abroad programs or the Washington Semester program) may also receive credit for internships *at the discretion of the relevant department or program.*

- *If I am paid for my internship, can I still receive credit?*

- Yes! If your employer pays you for your work, it has no bearing on your ability to receive credit.

- *In the past, what duties have been assigned to students during their internships?*

All types of experiences may accompany your internship. For example, F&M students have:

- Accompanied attorneys to court to learn about legal proceedings.
- Served as an educational ambassador at a public zoo.
- Assisted in the management of the customer relations database of a professional baseball team.
- Devised lesson plans and instructed students at an inner-city elementary school.
- Developed ideas for promotions and contests for a weekly women's magazine.
- Assisted producers and filled-in as associate producer for the noon news telecast at a major market television station.
- Aided brokers in preparing seminars and client presentations at a large financial institution.
